- 4. Request Approval of J Street Closure Between 15th Street and 16th Street-From 8:00 A.M. to 10:00 P.M.-Saturday October 15-Autism Awareness-Food Vendors and Music-Sara Swaagman, Kevin Jamison
 - Sara was not able to attend, Kevin Jamison spoke on her behalf.
 - The request is to close J Street between 15th and 16th Street for Autism Awareness.
 - Kevin said they will have music and vendors along J Street.
 - Mayor Craig stated the city requires that any merchants being affected by the closure be contacted before street closings are approved.
 - Mayor Craig requested Kevin contact the merchants and report back to City Hall
 - Motion is being made by Mayor Craig to approve the closure on the condition there are no issues with the affected business owners.

- 5. Request Approval of Reserving Seven (7) Temporary Parking Spaces for Early Voting Along 16th Street Going East From J Street to I Street-From October 11th to November 8th-Requested by County Clerk Billie Tumey-David Flinn
 - David Flinn said the County Clerk is asking for seven (7) parking spaces for early voting on 16th Street from October 11th to November 8th.

6. Request Approval and Acceptance of Agreed Order-Del Schulenburg-Misty Adams

- Misty is requesting the approval of the agreement of \$50,000 to Del Schulenburg.
- The City filed a complaint on June 28, 2022, seeking to acquire certain interests in the property owned by Del Schulenburg, lots 19, 20 and 21 in Howard Addition for the Spider Creek Project.
- The property will extend the Spider Creek Lift Station.
- Mr. Schulenburg filed a Consent and Waiver of Hearing on July 25, 2022.
- Upon the receipt of the \$50,000 there can be no pre or post judgements applied to this agreement.

7. Request Approval of Traffic Sign Plan Project Title Page-David Flinn

- INDOT is requesting a Title Page for the Sign Plan Project be signed.
- The title page is for First Group, which is the engineering firm for the Sign Plan Project.
- The Project will be replacing every regulatory sign in the city. This does not include informational signs such as street signs.
- David said the project cost is over 1 million dollars
- The Sign Project is a directive from the State.
- The Federal Grant for project is 90/10.
- The project may begin early next summer.

- Dennis stated he was given the template for revision and inadvertently missed the revision date. The date will be updated to reflect the current year.

- Chief Moore said the Police Department has a used in-car computer and mount that has not been used for several years.
- The computer was purchased as a trial computer and did not fit the needs of the Police Department
- Chief Moore is requesting to donate the equipment to Oolitic PD for the amount of \$1.00

- Chief Moore said he was not sure what type of sign will be needed there but is requesting to have signage, once determined.
- Mayor Craig said his suggestion is to approve signage at 7 ½ Street or Lincoln Avenue.

- A hold can be placed on the tax refunds of individuals who are delinquent on their utility bill.
- The success rate through this system has a better success rate than the city currently has with Stone City Collections.
